
Our Cave Of Character (Pt.1) Where Destinies Are Determined

- <u>David</u>---called and anointed for Kingship—I Samuel 16:5-13
 <u>Passed submission test</u>---I Samuel 18:10-16; I Samuel 19:9-11; I Samuel 24:3-7
 <u>Key Point</u>: David waited 15-20 years for his time of prophetic usability to arrive.
- Joseph—receives dream from the Lord---Genesis 37:5-11
 Passes the heart-attitude and integrity test
 --Genesis 37-50:20; Gen.39:7-12; Ps. 105:16-21
 Key Point: Joseph waited 12-13 years for prophetic fulfillment of Divine purpose.
- Isoshua---called and anointed by God as a mighty and skilled warrior---Exodus 17:8-16 Passes the servanthood and preparation tests---served Moses and God's people faithfully Key Point: Joshua waited for approximately 35-40 years---loving God, not position---before his personal leadership opportunity emerged to succeed Moses as leader of all Israel---Joshua 1
